- The Lord allowed me to complete my education in construction at the New Castle School of Trades. I graduated in January. I am thankful for what I've learned about building. My goal is to take this knowledge and to teach young men these skills in a Christian environment as well as build homes for the displaced refugees from the war. Some are still homeless and living in tents at the airport. This will be a great way to share the Gospel as well as provide for their physical need of homes.

- I was given many preaching opportunities this year at my home church as well as other area churches. I am always grateful for the opportunity to share God's Word!

- Some new churches have contacted me and shown an interest in the ministry. I look forward to presenting CAR to them.

-Dad Walker went to be with the Lord in 2018. I miss him, but I know I will be with him again one day.

-I am so thankful to be able to report that the Lord has sent a shipping company for the containers! Last week I did the final preparations for them to be locked. AMEN! I have set aside all donated monies for this project through the years. The money for shipment is available, but I am looking to raise another \$15,000 for the custom service once they arrive in Cameroon. (They must be transported through Cameroon because CAR is landlocked and has no access to water.) The Lord has put me in contact with Christian people in charge of container transportation in Cameroon and CAR. They are willing to work with me because the items in the containers will be used for ministry. If not for these folks, the price would be at least double. I am thankful for them. Please pray for protection for the containers from the US to CAR, and even after they arrive. I need to be there when they reach Cameroon. Drivers will then take them into CAR where I will unload and organize. Once they leave here, it usually takes 20-30 days to reach Africa. I like to thank brother Scott Dalton and brother Doug Murtoff for all they help with containers so far. I will keep you updated as the Lord continues to answer prayer concerning this project. It has been a long time coming, but I know His way is perfect. I thank each of you for your patience and understanding during this process.

Thank you again for your partnership in this ministry. May the Lord bless and keep you in 2019.
